[Credo Reference](#) is a good starting place for research with results from a library of trusted reference sources. Credo can be described as a scholarly, peer-reviewed Wikipedia. Ad and clutter-free, it features more than 3,400,000 full text entries from 800 reference books. Explore topic pages, images, full-text articles and books. Create a Mind Map (Brainstorming tool).

[Academic Search Premier](#): The world's largest academic multi-disciplinary database, Academic Search Premier provides full text for more than 4,600 journals, including more than 3,900 peer-reviewed titles. PDF backfiles to 1975 or further are available for well over one hundred journals and searchable, cited references are provided for more than 1,000 titles. This database is updated on a daily basis, via EBSCOhost.

EBSCOhost Electronic Books (eBooks)

Calhoun students, faculty, and staff have access to over 46,500 full-text eBooks (more than 200 Criminal Justice titles) which can be *checked out* and *downloaded*. eBooks appear along with print materials when you search the [Library Catalog](#).

In addition, you can search just the collection of [EBSCOhost eBooks](#). Search by author, title, subject, keyword and full-text. For hard to find information, search by 'full-text' and you will be searching the content of the eBook collection.
